Successful participation in the ICP and a listing on the Interstate Milk Shippers (IMS) List will enable the importation of Grade "A" milk and/or milk products into the United States from milk processing plants located outside of the U.S. boundaries.

- A fillable template of a National Conference on Interstate Milk Shipments Voluntary International Certification Pilot Program Memorandum of Agreement Between a Third Party Certifier and a Milk Company.
